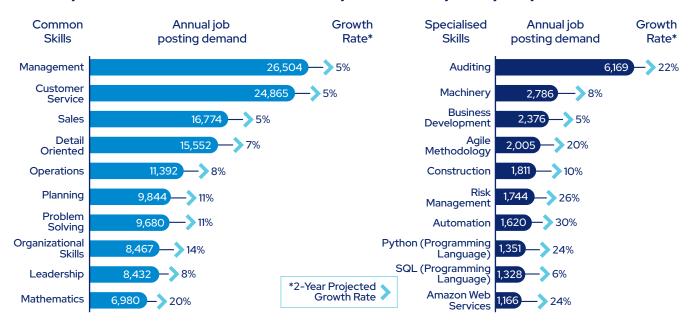
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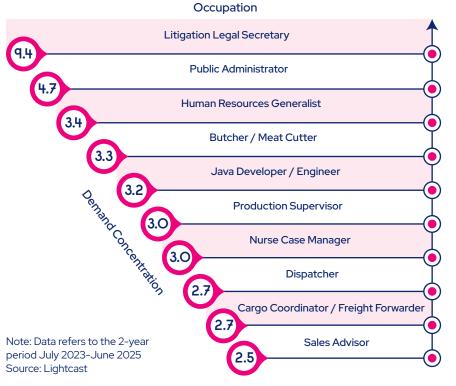

Service leaver skills requested by employers

Service leavers skills align with both economic resilience and sectoral diversification in Northern Ireland. Automation, agile methodology, and risk management skills boost manufacturing competitiveness for Northern Ireland. Auditing, operations, and problem solving are critical across healthcare and industry. Additionally, demand for Python, SQL and AWS link Service leaver digital talent to the nation's Advanced Manufacturing and Life Sciences clusters.

Service leaver occupations by demand concentration

There is concentrated demand for occupations such as Java Developers (in demand 3.2 times the UK average) and Production Supervisors (3.0 times the demand), underscoring Northern Ireland's dual emphasis on digital capability and industrial output Litigation Legal Secretaries are in demand 9.4 times more than the UK average and Public Administrators - with 4.7 times the UK average demand - point to strong demand in legal and public administration fields.

UK Industrial Strategy sectors by employment concentration

Employment in Advanced

UK average, driving demand
for Service leaver roles such as
Systems Engineers and Logistics
Coordinators.

Life Sciences are 1.2 times more concentrated here than the UK average, with opportunities for Registered Nurses and Pharmacy Technicians.
